RG asked if anyone was unhappy with any aspects of the service charge. She said

she thought the quoted audit fee seems high.

MW asked if we can find out what Freshwater's buildings insurance covers, so residents can arrange appropriate contents insurance. PW noted it is difficult to get contents insurance here because of the proximity to the river.
