

Notes from CALAG meeting 2nd July 2013

Notes taken regarding issues around Wilford Lane

Tram line

Lots of problems with vibration to nearby residences. Contractor will install some vibration reducing panels but not all along the line. The Kangaroo ticket is now not valid on line 1 because of the change in operator and the numbers of users has reduced considerably. People will not pay once, twice or three times for a journey that they once paid one price for.

Beeston shops are suffering badly. It is a loss making venture. The County Council is now labour run and may not make any financial contribution to the completion of lines 2 and 3.

Lots of problems, one person has sued the contractor for damage due to bad vibration at his home.

Sainsburys

Nothing much happening at the moment, some soil testing has taken place.

Surgery

Now the surgery has applied for and had granted an application for a 'temporary pharmacy' on the site. At the moment pharmacies are licensed to open for 100 hours per week, after September this is to be reduced to 60. The application has been put in and passed so that they have a license for the higher 100 hours and can continue to operate on these hours going forward. A temporary portacabin structure is to be set up behind the hedge on the site, to house a temporary pharmacy. This is to happen at the same time as the construction of the site.

Nursery – Bruce Drive

100 place nursery planning application has been submitted, nothing further at the moment.

Crossing outside Rivermead

No further news yet, a traffic study was completed and results will be available soon.

Becket school site

Now cleared and a fence erected around the site, but no planning application has been submitted for the site.

Police report

Rates of burglary rose recently, but following an arrest these have reduced accordingly. Lots of bike thefts from Roko and Asda.
